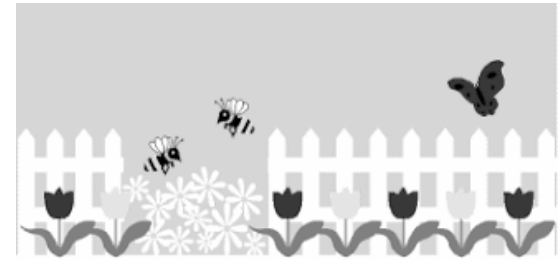

Autism: Including Children with Social Communication and Behavioral Needs - Molly Hughes

This workshop will explore the key characteristics of Autism Spectrum Disorder and give early childhood practitioners tools to more effectively include a child with autism in their child care setting. Included in this interactive workshop are myths and facts about ASD as well as practical strategies and tips for inclusion.

Making and Keeping Friends: The Importance of Friendship Skill - Dana Ellingson

This course examines the important relationship between mental health and social development. Participants will explore key friendship skills and social competencies needed for children to be successful in their social relationships. Strategies will include how to use activities to promote skills to avoid aggression and build self-esteem in all children.

Active Supervision: What else is in the home - Carrie Speikers

10:15am-12:15pm - VII.B/CDA 1

Meets the Family Child Care provider annual supervision training requirement. This training curriculum will assist participants in assessing and outlining possible hazards throughout the entire home; acting on and eliminating hazards using suggested resolutions and resources for additional information; learn to identify "hot spots" in the home; and develop a plan for regular review of home environmental hazards.

Cooking and Gardening with Children: Strategies to Build Healthy Relationships with Food - Dana Ellingson

1:00pm-3:00pm - II.A/Level 1/CDA 2

Explore ways to create excitement in children with relation to gardening and healthy foods in their educational environment. Identify how cooking with children offers exciting moments that use open-ended materials which support children's curiosity, creativity, discovery, decision-making, confidence, problem-solving, science, math, language, social, and physical skills. Enjoy moments of tangible idea implementation including mealtime rituals, gardening, and cooking with any age group.

SUIDS/AHT - Pam Bohm

1:00pm-3:00pm - VII.B/Level 1/CDA 1

This class meets DHS Licensing training requirements for both Sudden Unexpected Infant Death (SUID) and Abusive Head Trauma (AHT). Content includes recommendations to reduce Sudden, Unexpected Infant Deaths (SUID) including SIDS, suffocation, and other sleep related infant deaths; safe sleep environments; MN Child Care regulations related to safe sleep; as well as symptoms and consequences of abusive head trauma, risk factors for abusive head trauma; strategies to use when stressed, angry or frustrated.
